

Organization of Exams from Pathological physiology 2020/2021

1. Exams from Pathological physiology in the school year 2020/ 2021 are organized in distant way – through internet communication. Exam is composed of 2 parts: written part (ROGO test) and oral part (3 subquestions). Both parts are done according to the obvious scheme and requirements (conditions of exam in our web page).

2. **The written part of exam** is performed in a distant form (Rogo test) on Monday at 14:00 for students who are registered for the oral exam (AIS2) in that week. The method of registration and other aspects are carried out in the same way as during the semester. Test results are the part of exam evaluation and mark is announced in AIS2.

- General medicine - 35 questions, test duration 70 min
- Dentistry - 30 questions, test duration 60 min

3. **The oral part of exam** proceeds according to the date registered in AIS2. Students have to log into the MsTeams virtual exam room (**PATFYZ/ Exam**) at 8.00 AM. Students get the question number as generated on-line by a random number generator. Examiners are chosen randomly according to departmental rules. In addition to name of examiner and question number, students are also announced approximate exam time in that day.

- Exams starts at about 9.00 and continues according to the time schedule. In due time students log into examiner's MsTeams account (**Patfyz-exam-surname**). This is a virtual exam room. After connection student is to announce to the examiner the presence and waits for instructions.
- Student is going to show the examiner an **identification card** and the **number of the question** that she/he has received. In turn, examiner tell the student the content of the question including subquestions 1 from general pathophysiology and 2. and 3. special pathophysiology. Each subquestion is followed by an answer.
- The student is given a short time to reconsider the the structure of the answer. Examiner should navigate the student what is expected to be included in the answer, structure of or required data. Student answer to examiners questions. Typically the answer include: 1. Definition, 2. Occurence, 3. Forms (classification) 3.Causes, 4. Pathogenesis, 5. Manifestations (+Lab. data). For notes, student can use a blank paper and pen.
- In order to precise the decision, examiner can also ask supplementary questions, from other tropics e.g. from the semester work
- After the answers to all questions the examiner announces the student the result of the exam. Student have either accept or to refuse the mark, unambiguously.
- The examinee – student may terminate the exam prematurely by unequivocal statement. Than, the evaluation is FX and student can continue on the next term.

The process is similar to real exams. The examination of one student can be unexpectedly get shorten or prolonged, and there are also hygienic breaks and other circumstances solved operatively. Therefore, students have to be available min. 30 min before the specified time. The examiner can actively call student according to the time disposition.

Distant exams are to provide objective verification of the student's knowledge from the subject, in a similar way as being present physically in the exam. By signing up for the distant exam, the student honestly declares that her/ his actions will be in accordance with ethics and the study rules. The student is obliged:

- to ensure that his visual and auditory connection is continuous from beginning to end, uninterrupted, allowing to evaluate all student's actions` connection as done typically via computer, not through a phone.
- to respect the examiner's instructions and to rule out any possible unfair conduct:
 - during the exam, the student's hands must be visible (e.g. mummy position); optimally, the upper half of the body should be visible
 - The student is answering by heart to examiners questions; if necessary the examiner can ask him/her to look away from the camera (monitor) or close the eyes when answering
 - No one else may be present in the room at the time of the exam except the student; the student may not use help in classical (written, spoken) or electronic form (sound, image),
 - Monitor of students comp should provide nothing more than just a MsTeams communication. Headphones or earphones should not be used.

To ensure an objectivity, process of examination is continuously videorecorded in MS teams for departmental purposes. Content is not provided to any other sites.

Provided that in spite of all possible efforts, it is not possible to make an assessment of the student knowledge due to: a) technical problems on the part of the examinee and/or b) violation of the study and exam rules, the examiner can finish an exam with rating – „insufficient (FX)“.
